2018 - Led a major reorganization and re-launch of the Center for the Advancement of Teaching with four areas of influence: individual instruction; department-based curriculum and assessment; university-wide policies and procedures; and contribution to the scholarship of teaching and learning in higher education.

Center offers targeted, evidence-informed guidance to individual teachers, departments, and university leaders; hosts regular conferences, institutes, and workshops; cultivates a supportive, interdisciplinary teaching community via reading groups, faculty learning communities, and informal networking opportunities; offers financial support to teachers, departments, and researchers in the form of small-scale grants and awards; and advances national and international conversations about teaching through research, public scholarship, and professional service.

As a founding Assistant Director, worked to launch Rice's Center for Teaching Excellence from the ground up. Collaborated with colleagues to develop and market the traditional programming and services of a teaching center: workshops, book discussions, course design institutes, learning communities, consultations, classroom observations, and the collection of student feedback. Also proposed and developed a "Customized Research Review" service to answer faculty questions about pedagogy and build our credibility as experts on teaching and learning.

Planned and facilitated three major events each year: a symposium on teaching and learning, a university-wide teaching award ceremony, and an open observation day that encouraged faculty to visit the classrooms of award-winning teachers. Worked closely with the Provost's office on New Faculty Orientation and offered numerous customized-workshops for individual departments.

Worked with colleagues to design one of the first fully-accredited Graduate Certificates in Teaching and Learning for PhD students planning careers in academia. Taught all four courses in the curriculum, but spent the most time developing and teaching the research course. Supported graduate students outside the certificate program via TA Training, Graduate Instructor of Record Orientation, and launching a Graduate Fellows program in my final year.

Supported the logistical work of the center by helping to design the website; developing a database and managing program assessment; creating a teaching and learning library; and working with multiple advisory boards (undergraduate, graduate, and faculty).
